

HOW TRITON COUNTS WINDOWS

PLEASE USE THE BELOW GUIDE TO SEE HOW TRITON WINDOW CLEANING WILL COUNT WINDOWS



Attached are examples of typical window configurations we clean on job sites. In each picture you can see how each window type is counted and how that will be deducted from your voucher totals. Vouchers are good for 20 interior/exterior windows or 10 if both sides of the windows are cleaned. Please examine these pictures and count the windows based on these examples.

Double hung windows – the entire window assembly counts as one window.



Side-by-side windows (including rollouts) – each pane/side counts as a separate window.



Picture windows & transom windows – Each picture and transom will be counted separately, as notated below.



Sliding doors and side-sliding windows - Each panel or piece of glass on the door will count as separate windows.



Door glass – Each piece of glass on the side of the door or above the door (transoms) will be counted separately.

Storm doors and pieces of glass within the main door will also be counted separately.



Storm windows – storm windows, the outer windows pictured here, will incur a \$10 per pane charge (\$20 per double hung assembly).



French paned windows and doors – If a window is paneled, as depicted below, an extra .50/pane per side charge will be incurred. The glass on the door will count as 1 window and each individual pane will be added as an additional cost. In this example there are 18 panes on each door. It would be \$9.00 extra for an exterior cleaning and \$18.00 extra for an inside/outside cleaning. Many newer windows will have mimic the styling but will have stylistic lines embedded inside the double panes. There are also windows with removable inserts; those can be popped out and no pane charge will be incurred.
